5.	If you chose cremation is there a preferred crematorium?			
6.	Are there strong views for ashes scattering or burial?			
7.	What sort of funeral service would the deceased want: formal and informal, religious or non-religious, simple or something more elaborate?			
8.	Is there someone in mind to lead the service?
